CONDITIONS FOR APPROVED ASH SALES

The complete SOCIETY REGULATIONS for Approved ASH Sales (including Vendor, Organiser and Agent Responsibilities), Drugs Policy and Identification of Horses are available from Head Office or the Society's Website – www.ashs.com.au

In relation to Approved ASH Sales, members should be familiar with all the Society's Regulations, in particular the following main points:

1. All horses must be Australian Stock Horse registered. If the horse's registration has not been finalised by the close of nominations, the horse will not be accepted into the catalogue.
2. The name of the vendor must be the same as the name of the Registered Owner which the horse is currently registered with the Society.
3. All nomination forms must be submitted as indicated with a copy of the horse's registration papers. The Society recommends that a good quality colour picture of the horse (photograph or JPEG file) be submitted to the Society by post or email with the name of the sale and sale date, as well as the horse's registered name and number prior to the Sale. If submitted, the picture will be loaded with the Sale Catalogue on the Society's Online Stud Book at no charge.
4. Nominations must be submitted by the closing date and will not be accepted unless accompanied by the nomination fee. Once a horse has been accepted into the catalogue, there is no refund on the nomination fee. Nomination Forms without a vendor's signature will not be accepted.
5. Owners are required to compare the horse's Certificate of Registration to the horse being nominated (prior to entering the horse) into an ASH event; ie, sex, colour, brands, markings, etc. Owners are advised to review the Society's Regulations in relation to Horse Identification, in particular the verification of brands and markings policies. A horse may be REJECTED from an Approved ASH Sale under the Identification Regulations due to a brand or marking discrepancy.
6. The Inspector may REJECT a horse from the sale if the horse does not comply with the following conditions: The horse should be prepared and presented suitably for the sale and should be free of undesirable characteristics and conformation faults.
7. Any person involved with handling the horse on the day of the sale, within the perimeter of the grounds; ie, strapper, handler, trainer, rider and the like must be a competition eligible financial member of the Society. Temporary Membership is NOT available.
8. Youth under 18 years of age must wear an equestrian helmet approved by the current Australian Standards Association or International equivalent, which MUST be securely fastened under the chin, when mounted anywhere within the perimeter of the grounds, including all public areas, as well as leading or handling a horse.
9. Remarks on the horse must be restricted to a maximum of forty words, or comments will be shortened. References to other breeds are not permitted during the sale or in the catalogue.
10. The following must be disclosed by the Vendor to the Auctioneer prior to sale and the Auctioneer will disclose these facts at time of sale:
 - Any horse addicted to windsucking or showing any symptoms of being a wobbler or roarer.
 - Any horse being a cryptorchid or showing a visible deformity of the genitalia.
 - Where the Vendor has retained semen or embryos.
11. Drugs Policy - All horses competing in Australian Stock Horse Society (ASHS) events or being offered at ASH Approved Sales are subject to a No Prohibited Substance rule. This means that no Prohibited Substance is to be administered to the horse in the time before an event or sale such that it, or any ingredient or metabolism of it, might be present in the horse, might be detectable in its blood, saliva and/or urine samples, or might have any effect on its performance at the time of the event or sale.
12. Mandatory testing for Genetic Disorders is in a phase-in stage with the Society and has commenced. Horses recording a positive result for Genetic Disorders as a carrier or affected, with the Society or other Associations, must be disclosed at sales (private or auction) and all breeding opportunities. Vendors should refer to the Rules & Regulations, Section 3 – Registration of Horses, rule 13.3.
13. The Sale Committee reserves the right to restrict the number of entries (if excessive).
14. By nominating a horse in this sale, I/we agree to be bound by the Rules, Regulations and Codes of Conduct governing the affairs of the Society.
15. Neither the organising committee nor The Australian Stock Horse Society Limited accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury to horses, riders, beasts, ground, spectators, or any other person or property whatsoever.

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS OF SALE

(as requested by the Organiser/Agent and approved by the Board)

- I/we accept the Conditions for Approved ASH Sales and agree to act in accordance with The Australian Stock Horse Society Limited Rules and Regulations, Code of Conduct and ASHS policies.
- If there are more than 100 horses nominated in the sale, vendors may be limited to a maximum of two nominations. The minimum start up price for bidding is set at \$1,500. The Registered Owner must be a financial for 2020 at time of nomination.
- ONLY horses born between 1st August 2017 and 31st July 2019 are eligible for nomination. The horse's registration has not been finalised by the close of nominations, otherwise the nomination will not be accepted.
- A Society Inspector appointed for National Show must inspect each horse prior to being paraded for the sale. Inspections will be available at allocated times during the National Show. It is the responsibility of the owner to ensure that the horse is presented for inspection. The original Certificate of Registration must be handed to and retained by the Society Inspector at time of inspection. Owner at time of inspection to advise the inspector that the horse is a Fountain of Youth Sale horse.
- All horses must be led ONLY, not ridden. Any person involved with handling the horse on day of sale, within the perimeter of the grounds; ie, strapper, handler, trainer, rider and the like must be a Competition Eligible Financial Member of the Society. Temporary Membership will not be offered for this event.
- **All horse movements must be in accordance with DPI requirements for any State the horse is being transported.**
- **Sale Agent - Landmark Operations Limited - ABN 73 008 743 217 (to be renamed Nutrien Ag Solutions Limited - ABN 73 008 743 217, effective 1st February 2020).** Commission will be payable by the vendor to the Auctioneer in respect of each Lot catalogued and sold. Commission is 7% of the sale price and is applicable from day of sale to 14 days after the advertised sale date, whether sold at Auction or Private Treaty.
- Fees in relation to the nomination are not refundable. Transfer Fee: Deducted from Sale Proceeds.
- I understand horses may be randomly drug tested at ASH events and sales.
- The **National Futurity** nomination fee for the horse will be eligible for a **\$90.00 discount**. The purchaser is responsible for ensuring that the Nomination Fee for the National Futurity is made to The Australian Stock Horse Society by the required date for the horse to be eligible to compete in the National Futurity.

STABLE AND PARKING BOOKINGS

- PARKING FEES are NOT included, please book online – www.nominate.com.au or contact AELEC – 02 6767 5658.
- Stabling is provided from Friday 24th April to 9.00 am, Tuesday 28th April only – Nomination fee, including stabling is NOT refundable. Stables will be in **E & F Blocks**. **Stable cleaning for ALL sale horses is provided** and is NOT the responsibility of the vendor or purchaser. Owners are not required to clean out the stables as there is no refund offered on sale stables.
- It is the responsibility of the new owner (or, if not sold the vendor) to remove the horse from the stable or pay additional stabling as follows:
 - Remove the horse from the stable by 9.00 am, Tuesday 28th April 2020; or
 - If remaining in the stable after 9.00am, pay additional stabling fees at the AELEC office, no later than 9.00 am, Monday 27th April 2020.
